### TECHNOLOGY

The Technology portion of this family identifies opportunities to invest in the software, systems, networks, and tools that fuel innovation and power our 21<sup>st</sup> century global economy.

<b>SOCL</b>	Social Media Index ETF	Provides investors access to Social Media companies around the world.
<b>FINX</b>	FinTech Thematic ETF	Seeks to invest in companies on the leading edge of the emerging financial technology sector.
<b>SNSR</b>	Internet of Things Thematic ETF	Companies that stand to potentially benefit from the broader adoption of the Internet of Things.
<b>BOTZ</b>	Robotics & A.I. Thematic ETF	Companies that potentially stand to benefit from increased adoption and utilization of robotics and artificial intelligence.
<b>LIT</b>	Lithium ETF	Invests in the full lithium cycle, from mining and refining the metal, through battery production.

The Values portion of this family seeks to align personal values and investment strategies without sacrificing potential returns. Values-based investing can run across a spectrum of Environmental, Social and Corporate Governance ("ESG") themes and focuses on one or a cluster of issue areas.

<b>CATH</b>	S&P 500 <sup>®</sup> Catholic Values ETF	Companies within the S&P 500 <sup>®</sup> whose business practices adhere to the Socially Responsible Investment Guidelines as outlined by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (U.S. CCB).



### PEOPLE

The People portion of this family invests in companies that stand to benefit from demographic changes, as well as changes in consumption habits or lifestyle choices.

<b>MILN</b>	Millennials Thematic ETF	Companies that have a high likelihood of benefiting from the rising spending power and unique preferences of the U.S. Millennial generation.
<b>LNGR</b>	Longevity Thematic ETF	Companies positioned to serve the world's growing senior population through exposure to sectors that contribute to increasing lifespans and extending quality of life in advanced age.
<b>BFIT</b>	Health & Wellness Thematic ETF	Seeks to harness the effects of changing consumer lifestyles by investing in companies geared toward promoting physical activity and well-being.



## RESOURCES



The Resources portion of this family seeks to align opportunities for investment in commodity miners across a variety of areas, but chiefly those in the traditional scope of metals, mining, and agriculture.

<b>COPX</b>	Copper Miners ETF	Provides investors access to a broad range of copper mining companies.
<b>SOIL</b>	Fertilizers/Potash ETF	Offers targeted exposure to fertilizer producers around the world, giving investors access to a critical agricultural industry.
<b>GOEX</b>	Gold Explorers ETF	Provides investors access to a broad range of companies involved in the exploration of gold deposits.
<b>SIL</b>	Silver Miners ETF	Provides investors access to a broad range of silver mining companies.
<b>URA</b>	Uranium ETF	Provides investors access to a broad range of uranium mining companies.

FINX, SNSR, BOTZ and MILN invest in securities of companies engaged in Information Technology which can be affected by rapid product obsolescence, and intense industry competition.

KRMA may underperform other similar funds that do not consider conscious company guidelines when making investment decisions.
